Lieutenant James Cook and the HMS Endeavour sailed into Bustard Bay on May 24th, 1770.

Originally known as Round Hill — after the creek it sits on — the town's name was changed in 1970 to commemorate the bicentennial of Cook's visit. The 1770 Dragons are lucky enough to call this beautiful and historic place home, training in the estuary while watching dolphins play and the sun set over the distant hills. The crew consists of paddling divisions, from Masters to Great Grand Dragons. Just two years old, the team has gone from last place overall in 2010, to first place overall in 2011 in the Wide Bay Regional Series.
